# THE AUDITION INFORMATION

### Thank you for your interest in Patterson River Secondary Colleges Production of HAIRSPRAY!

Hairspray is well known for it's lively music such as You Can't stop the Beat, Welcome to the 60s and The Nicest Kids in Town! It's 1962 – the 50's are out and change is in the air. Tracy Turnblad, a big girl with big hair and an even bigger heart, is transformed into a teen celebrity on the local TV dance program; The Corny Collins Show. Can Tracy win the love of heartthrob Link Larkin and integrate the television show without denting her 'do? With her striking stage mother Edna at her side, Tracy and her friends triumphantly tell us to be proud of who we are.

Auditions will take place in the theatre of the Performing Arts Centre, which is separate to the waiting area, so no one else will see your audition. Please arrive at your audition 5 minutes beforehand and wait in the foyer area, adjacent to the car park.

WEDNESDAY 10<sup>th</sup> February- **Movement/Dance Audition** (Anyone who is not wishing to be apart of the ensemble with attend only on the Wednesday. The ensemble supports the lead characters in many scenes and will have a number of movement phrases to remember. Those considered for a lead role will be asked to attend this movement audition as well.)

#### **PERFORMANCE DATES:**

The dates for HAIRSPRAY are Thursday 21st, Friday 22nd and Saturday 23rd July (Term 3, Week 2). We will also be having a full dress rehearsal for the Primary Schools on Thursday and Friday during school hours.

### **REHEARSALS:**

This show must assume priority and so we ask that if you have any other commitments on these nights you reconsider your priorities.

Rehearsal for will take place MONDAY 3pm-5pm and one most likely FRIDAY lunchtimes for leads and ensemble members. Please be aware that sometimes only lead characters will be required to attend the full Monday night rehearsals, ensemble members will be required until 4pm however this may via week to week. Students will receive a rehearsal schedule every 5 weeks which will have the breakdown of nights required. However due to public holidays and school events some Monday night rehearsals have been changed to a Tuesday afterschool. Students will receive an outline of keys dates during their first rehearsal.

If successful with your audition, each member of the production is asked to contribute a non-refundable production fee of \$50 as a sign of good faith and commitment to this endeavor. This contribution will go directly into the Musical Production account to help with costs of the play, costumes, set, make-up, props etc. This cost will also include a HAIRSPRAY Production t-shirt. Payment should be made at the General Office and paid by 7<sup>th</sup> March; otherwise your position will be forfeited in the cast.

### THE AUDITION PROCESS

- All those wishing to join the cast for this production (leads or ensemble) are required to audition, either the movement or vocal/acting audition. When casting is final, leads will be required to sing, dance and act, whereas ensembles will support the leads with singing, dancing and acting.
- Some individual auditions will be filmed to help the panel make a discussion. Please note, only the panel will view these filmed auditions.
- Prior experience isn't necessary to audition. We don't just expect the 'best' dancers, singers and actors, we like to recognise potential and work with individuals throughout the process.

#### **AUDITION STRUCTURE:**

- <u>VOCAL/ACTING AUDITION-</u> Once you have signed up for auditions, you will be booked into a 5-minute timeslots. Within this time, you will sing your chosen song and read your monologue. Monologues can be collected when signing up and can be brought into the audition if needed. However, we suggest you learn the entire monologue to ensure a smooth and confident performance.
- MOVEMENT/DANCE AUDITION- If you are auditioning just for ensemble you will not need to book in a time for the acting/vocal audition, however you will need to attend the movement audition. You will still need to sign up but ONLY for the Wednesday audition.

## VOCAL AUDITION REQUIREMENTS AND PREPARATION (Mon 8<sup>th</sup>- Tues 9<sup>th</sup> Feb):

- Please prepare one song, preferably a musical theatre song or a pop song- make sure it's something that you enjoy singing. If you are auditioning for a lead character you will need to sing at least 16 bars (approx. 30 seconds). You can prepare a piece from the show.
- Ensure that your selections are in keeping with the style of the show (if possible) and/or the character/s you are auditioning for. Prepare a piece that reveals the best of you and your vocal ability to the audition panel.
- An accompanist like CDs or backing tracks will be accepted however it will need to be a karaoke version.

### MOVEMENT/DANCE AUDITION (Wed 10<sup>th</sup> Feb):

Those who would like to be an ensemble member you will participate in a choreographed dance routine, which will be taught on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> February. This will take place in a large group and with everyone who is auditioning. Please wear suitable clothing. Please note, you might be selected to be in the ensemble which is mainly dancing but you will still be singing and acting in a group. Those auditioning for a lead role, might be asked to attend this movement audition.

#### CALLBACKS/WORKSHOP:

Callbacks will take the form of an audition workshop where you will be given readings, choreography and songs from the show. This will allow the production team to see how you take direction, work with others and learn new material, under a supportive environment free from the stress of nerves.

### **CAST ANNOUNCEMENT:**

Cast announcement will be on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> February. The cast list will be posted on the Performing Arts Centre window. Once the cast has been announced, we will have a whole cast meeting/rehearsal on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February to hand out information/forms, discuss storyline, hand out scripts, introduce the cast, measure you for Production T-Shirts etc. The decision of the production team is final and discussions regarding casting will not be entered into.

### TO SIGN UP FOR AN AUDITION:

Auditions can only be made by person. Please contact Ms Witteveen to book a time. Sign ups in the Library at lunchtimes between Monday 1<sup>st</sup> – Friday 5th February. If you do not sign up for an audition, you will NOT be able to audition.

We look forward to seeing you at the auditions and please do tell all your friends about this fantastic opportunity. This is an exciting experience that we can't wait to share with you!
